## **SOS: Sending Our Service**

Everyone knows that when a weather-related tragedy strikes the impact is going to be great.

Whether it is from a flood, fire, tornado, or hurricane, someone somewhere is going to need our help.

Last month's hurricane hit Florida with such force it wiped long-standing buildings off their foundation and swept their contents out to sea.

The initial impact included 2.5 million evacuees.

During the storm and in the days that followed, more than 1,600 people had to been rescued.

It was Florida's deadliest since 1935. There are 135 people confirmed dead and five still missing.

At least 11,000 homes were destroyed or had major damage. One of those was a friend of mine who lost everything to lan and has currently relocated to Pennsylvania with family.

According to unofficial estimates, roughly 580,000 of Florida's 11 million business and residential customers remained without power on the afternoon of October 3, down from roughly 2.7 million on September 29.

The impact was tremendous.

The impact on Moose Lodges in South Florida was also great.

But while they were trying to rebuild their personal lives, they were also there helping others rebuild theirs by providing meals, water, supplies, and other necessities.

Other lodges in the state quickly set up donation sites in their respective areas and drove the items to the region for distribution.

There were even tractor trailers full of supplies from Moose Lodges from across United States who made their way to South Florida.

Talk about making an impact!

There are currently hundreds of Moose members who are without homes, and at least a dozen lodges with major to minor damage that have either been forced to keep their Lodge home closed or at best partially open to serve those in need.

How can you help?

The Florida Moose Association has a Disaster Relief Fund to help those impacted by disasters like Hurricane Ian.
