Tommy Moose[®] is a friendly, playful, cuddly moose doll whose sole purpose is to bring comfort to children in times of stress, uncertainty, or anxiety. He personifies one of the cornerstone tenants of the Loyal Order of Moose: caring for children.

The National Institutes of Health recognizes that "helping children begins at the scene of the event" to combat the fear, helplessness and



anxiety a child may feel during a stressful

that role-playing with cuddly plush dolls enables children to express feelings they may otherwise suppress.

In addition to the Tommy Moose dolls, Snider also brought back coloring books that will go to schools and daycares, and bookmarks that have internet safety tips to pass out at libraries and schools.

LaRosa and his wife Sherry took over the Alumni Association after they found a need to bridge the gap between Mooseheart graduates and students.

While this year's celebrations focused on former students, dedications, donations, and ceremonies, it also gave several state associations the opportunity to be part of the celebration just as it had in years past.

"Homecoming and graduation are a chance to be with the very kids we sup-

port," Woodward Moose Lodge's Administrator Bruce Snider said.

Snider, along with Lodge Trustee Jack Pierce, were at the school and cooked throughout the weekend.

"I love going up to see the children and see our friends at Moose International and Mooseheart,"

Jack Pierce said. "It is something to look forward to every year."

They weren't alone in their efforts. Members from Illinois, Oklahoma/Southern Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri/North Kansas, MD/DE/DC, Iowa, North Carolina, and Pennsylvania all traveled to Mooseheart for Homecoming.

"It's a big factor that helps unite our Oklahoma/Southern Kansas Moose Association," Pierce said.

But there's a much bigger picture when it comes to why they make the annual trek north.

"It gives me a chance to realize how petty our problems are compared to the problems these kids have endured in their childhood," Snider said.

LaRosa remembered the times when Lodge members would come to the campus.

"We always loved when loose lodges would come," LaRosa said.

"We were kids. It meant we got a little extra, something special. I truly believe the kids absolutely enjoy it. Personally the impact

> is mostly on the Moose member. I really enjoy the smiles on the Moose members faces because of the kids."

> "There is a lot of gratification in knowing that you've helped the children," Pierce said. "By providing a big meal for them, interacting with them, and getting to

know them – it is just very self-satisfying."

"I had a boy tell me two days ago that he had never eaten ribs," Bruce Snider said of his most recent experience. "He asked me if he could "borrow" a piece of foil to take the left over ribs on his plate to his house. He did not want to waste them. Only a Mooseheart kid. That's why I go."

"Going to Mooseheart kind of puts everything in perspective," LaRosa said. "We are products of Mooseheart. It really was a wonderful place to grow up."
